She has a couple of spots on her skin that the Veterinarians call moist dermatitis which is often caused by allergies to flea bites or even food (often wheat). This is usually treatable with medicated shampoo and/or readily available triple antibiotic and hydrocortisone creams.

She has some work to do on learning to take treats gently from your hand, but that is mainly due to her level of excitement when she knows it's treat time. You can see how happy she is and her tail wags frantically when she knows she is getting a treat.

Akima is very loving and affectionate. Being that she has entered her senior years, Akima has a laid back and calm personality. She likes to spend her day lazing about the house, mostly on her bed. However, she doesn't mind going for long walks or runs and enjoys taking in the scenery. Akima gets along with other dogs and loves meeting new people.
